Books will tell stories connected to the women and children's resilience in WWII and will be later recorded to preserve their testimonies in form of video. The next step of this tasks is training of the Living Books. Training will include: introduction to CERV and SURVIVE project, Human Library method (history, objectives, rights and duties of the Book, detailed organisation of the event), storytelling techniques, communication skills. During the training, Living Books will be supported in preparation of the title and abstract of their story, that will be used in the Books catalogue.
